1. Results of Survey of open winter storage availability elsewhere for members who do not have AYC Storage.

Not a great deal of response to the request to say the least. It is however a common problem due to the closure of storage facilities out on the Cherry Street Spit. One that is seems we are one of the few clubs who are working to assist affected members.

The efforts undertaken did however provide an offer of accommodation for next winter at a reasonable price for club members who do not have winter storage at AYC. The price is quite comparable to storage costs at AYC. There is a bit of logistical red tape we will need to hurdle though and I would like to get together with all those wanting to participate shortly after launch next spring. For those interested, be sure your cradle is accessible next spring because we will need to move it.

2. You may have noticed that NYC have completed renovations on their sea wall and have raised it up some six inches and slope it up hill to the parking lot. AYC have as well contacted the contractor to provide us (AYC) a quote which your Rear Commodore is

coordinating with our insurance provider.

3. Our upcoming lease agreement with the City of Toronto.

Bill Morris has taken on the role as our Chief Lease Negotiator. As you may know, we had shared a mutual concern for our lease expiry situation with NYC. As such we formed a cooperative team with representatives of NYC to start the long and complicated process of lease renewal with favorable terms which contain (in a nut shell), a rolling 5-year extension added automatically. We have formulated a go forward approach and will meet with the team next week to formalize and move forward with the plan. More details at the AGM.

4. High Water Discussions continue through The Council of Commodores who are lobbying Government who still maintain a safe distance from the issue. Sail Canada. Boating Canada, Canoe and Kayak Canada and all the affiliated recreational club users are working together to present a common front to Government at every opportunity. We will see how things progress. All projections for precipitation levels this winter show more snow and rain and no improvement for spring and summer 2020. Keep your wellington boots handy.

All are welcome to bring children and grandchildren for ornament making and cookie decorating – kids at heart also more than welcome! A Christmas film will be played for kids starting at 2pm so the adults can enjoy some wine and cheese with fellow members.

Again, this year we will be collecting money for charity, so please bring cash or your check book. This year we will be giving to the charity Sistering. Sistering is a multi-service agency for at-risk, socially isolated women in Toronto who are homeless or precariously housed. They do incredible work right here in Toronto and need all the support they can get so I hope everyone who comes to wine and cheese gives generously.

FOR YOUR CONSIDERATION AT THE AGM:

This year we tried eliminating the Social Fee in favour of making the reception after Sail Past ticketed to cover the event cost - and potentially make the job of organizing the event easier for future social directors. The ticket price went a long way towards making the event more fiscally responsible, but the job of collecting and confirming RSVPs made organizing catering numbers and seating a miserable, time consuming job. There was much opposition to the ticket price, and attendance was way down from 2018. Sail Past is the only event that is extremely difficult to organize because attendance is uncertain and the budget is high. The previous social fee was put in place to encourage attendance - it entitled senior members to 2 tickets and it was great for attendance, but the \$30 social fee did not come remotely close to covering the cost of the event. This past year we tried charging a fair price for tickets and came close to covering the cost of the event, but lost out on attendance - and lower attendance means fixed costs like the band, staffing and rentals are more expensive per person.

Sail Past is the one event that every member of the club who is able should attend. It is the day for all of us to come together as a community, get boats out on the water and salute our commodore, but I feel the ticket price for the reception this year kept a good portion of our membership away. Next year I am proposing that we try what I hope will be an agreeable solution to funding the party and encouraging attendance. The board is proposing a

\$60 Sail Past fee for all club members - senior and associate. This fee would include 1 non-transferable ticket to the Commodore's reception after Sail Past. The sail past fee would ensure that there is a guaranteed pool of money for future social directors to work with when organizing this event, and it would mean that guest tickets could be sold at lower prices – around \$40 or \$45 each.

I hope that the membership will support this measure so we can have a great, well attended Sail Past party in the summer of 2020 and going forward an easier event to organize for future social directors.
